

Agreement

Between

YORK UNIVERSITY

and

DAVIS UNIVERSITY

I. Purpose

- A. The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the general terms for the transfer of Davis University training program students proceeding to study at York University (York).
- B. Both York and Davis University understand that this agreement is not exclusive and each institution is permitted to enter into such agreements with other institutions.

II. Articulation of Transfer Students

- A. York agrees to consider applications from Davis University students who have finished the two-year training program for admission to its Bachelor's degree programs Davis University students that have satisfied the relevant requirements can be granted credit exemptions for some courses toward York's bachelor's degree program. The exact course average and language test requirements are specified under C below and the course credit exemption letter issued by York's admission office.
- B. York will consider the applications from Davis University students who will finish a Bachelor's degree at York for admission into the Master's degree programs, Post-Graduate Certificate programs, or into a different academic program on a case-by-case basis.
- C. Davis University students applying for admission to York will be admitted and reviewed for possible credit exemptions for some York courses towards York's Bachelor's degree based on the fulfillment of the following requirements:
 - i. A completed university application submitted by March 1st for Fall term admission (September start), or September 1st for Winter term admission (January start) or November 1st for Spring term admission (May start);
 - ii. Official university transcripts showing the academic scores of courses that meet the requirements for each of the programs included in Appendix 1, for post-secondary studies;
 - iii. Proof of English Language Proficiency test(s) as demonstrated through one of the following:
 - 1. a minimum score TOEFL iBT® of 88, or
 - 2. a minimum score IELTS score of 6.5, or
 - 3. One full year of study in an accredited university degree program in English in a country where English is a primary language or where English is the official language of the institution, or
 - 4. Two full years of study in English, in an accredited college diploma or applied degree program in a country where English is a primary language or where English is the official language of the institution

 - iv. York will recognize approved Davis University courses (see Appendix 1) for credit toward undergraduate degree programs outlined in Appendix 1. The total exempted credits from Davis University will not exceed 1/3 of the total credits the students earn for the degree.
 - v. Davis University students who meet the admissions minimum average and other course prerequisite requirements but who do not have the requisite English language proficiency may receive an offer of conditional admission to York University based on the completion of a program at the York University English Language Institute (YUELI). Students will first complete one of YUELI's relevant pathway programs before they start their undergraduate

studies at York. Students do not need to retake the TOEFL or IELTS tests again to meet York's English language proficiency requirement providing that the students pass the YUELI language program(s).

Note: Students could choose to apply for an ordinary or honors degree for most programs at York. Their offers of admission would indicate the type of degree they're admitted into. Once students start their undergraduate studies at York, they normally should take no longer than 2.0 years to complete an ordinary Bachelor's degree or no longer than 3.0 years to complete an honours Bachelor's degree at York. Please refer to the credit exemption letter for the credit exemption details.

- D. Davis University students who receive an offer of conditional admission via YUELI will be placed into the Academic Credit English (ACE) (previously called "York University Bridging" - YUB), Pre-Accelerated English (Pre-AE) (previously called "Pre-Destination York" - Pre-DY), or Accelerated English (AE) (previously called "Destination York" - DY) language program based on their TOEFL, IELTS or the ELI's own placement test scores. The English language requirement for the Academic Credit English (ACE) program is IELTS 5.0, TOEFL iBT 64; for the Pre-Accelerated English (Pre-AE) program, IELTS 5.5 or TOEFL iBT 69; and for the Accelerated English (AE) program, IELTS 6.0 or TOEFL iBT 76.
- E. Davis University students will be charged the international tuition rate for each term that they attend York. Students will also be responsible for room, board, and all other applicable fees.
- F. While enrolled in Davis University, Davis University students will not register at York; Davis University students will register as York students only after transferring to York following successful completion of 2 years (four semesters) of study at Davis University.
- G. All international and visiting students studying at York University, including Davis University students, are required to register and pay the applicable premium for the University Health Insurance Program (UHIP) for each academic term of study. - H. Davis University students will be eligible to apply for York's international student scholarships based on merit. Students' scholarship eligibility will give consideration to their academic performance during their study at York.
- I. Davis University students who meet the eligibility criteria set out in II (C) will be eligible for admission and may receive up to 39 credits (equivalent to approximately one year of university study) toward York programs outlined on Appendix 1. In addition to meeting the average required for admission to the programs in Appendix 1, individual course(s) must be completed with a final grade of 70% or higher to be eligible for credit exemptions.

III. Privacy and Confidentiality

- A. Non-disclosure. The Parties acknowledge that in the course of participating in these activities, the parties may have access to and the need to exchange Confidential Information including personally identifiable information, and that such information is subject to reasonable privacy and confidentiality obligations. The Parties agree to maintain reasonable security measures in respect of any documents or information in any form identified by the owner as confidential, and shall take all reasonable precautions to limit internal disclosure to those persons who are required to access such documents or information.
- B. FIPPA Obligations. Davis University acknowledges that York is subject to the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*. Davis University shall assist York in meeting its obligations to protect all personally identifiable information of its students, and shall treat all such information as strictly confidential. For further clarity, nothing in this Agreement or in any activities commenced thereunder will be construed to require either party to breach any obligation imposed by FIPPA.

IV. Intellectual Property

Unless explicitly agreed to the contrary in writing for a specific activity, each party retains all right, title and interest to its own work and any intellectual property rights therein. This agreement does not give either party any license of use or right over the intellectual property of the other party. The use of trademarks and/or denominations representative of either party is strictly prohibited without the other party's prior written consent.

V. Revision and Duration of Agreement


- A. The specific arrangements for articulation were determined through consultation between York and Davis University. Future changes or additions to the curriculum Davis University may be reviewed for potential inclusion into the course arrangement.
- B. The agreement shall be reviewed annually in time for implementation, modification, or cancellation in the following cycle of applications. If neither party have brought forward any changes to the agreement, the agreement will be considered valid.
- C. This agreement will be valid for five (5) years. Amendments to this Agreement have to be communicated with other party to the designated contact person and email address as follows and made in writing and signed by both parties.

- D. The Agreement may be terminated by either party giving six (6) months' notice in writing to the other party or such earlier termination date as is mutually agreed between the parties. In the event of a termination, the parties will honor all commitments to students participating in the program at the time of the termination.
- E. The Agreement will come into effect on the date of the last signature.

Appendix 1

Understanding Credit Exemptions York Undergraduate Degrees

When awarding credit exemptions for previous studies, York University reviews for three distinct degree requirements:

1. general education requirements, intended to provide students with a foundation of interdisciplinary studies;
2. major courses, previous studies that can potentially satisfy a specialization in an admitted subject area or combination of subject areas; and
3. courses outside major, intended to broaden the educational experience of students beyond their admitted subject areas or general education requirements.

For details about specific academic requirements for degree programs, see the Undergraduate Calendar at <http://calendars.registrar.yorku.ca/>. Students are strongly encouraged to review the Undergraduate Calendar for their specific degree program course requirements.

Below is a small sample of course requirements for a select number of degree programs at York University. For a full listing of all subjects and degrees at York University, please refer to the future student webpage at futurestudents.yorku.ca/program-search.

A minimum of 70% is required to receive direct course transfers for the Davis University courses listed in the table.

Other courses taken at Davis University may be eligible for credit exemptions for general education and elective credits.
